Who will be involved in the project/program?

The literary journal will be a Language Arts inter-disciplinary magazine that I will run. design and edit, with support from journalism students, to showcase student poetry, short stories, and potentially complementary art. I will appeal to language instructors to submit contributions from their students, including work in other languages with translation.

What are the benefits of this project/program to the students, college, and the community?

This project will showcase work from students across disciplines and allow from collaboration between Language, Speech, and Journalism. I will also reach out to Division Chairs across disciplines to see if there are any contributions other departments/divisions would like to make. Students will have access to a print and digital literary magazine. These magazines run by the Journalism department have been used by ESL and English, along with other programs, as learning/teaching instruments in classes.

How does this project/program support the College's Strategic Institutional Plan?

I believe this project aligns with Goal D, as it allows for hands-on student learning in both the creation of the special magazine, gives students a chance for creativity in the conceptional part, and allows students to read and learn from other students, while allowing for cross-pollination between departments.

Timeline for the project/program.

September: Reach out to and meet with various Language Arts Departments, Theater Arts, reach out to English and other divisions, and begin to "draw out" how the magazine will look (story book). Assign creative writing projects, poetry, etc., to some students. Roughly estimate page count by end of September.

October: Edit first content coming in. Follow up with departments. Begin to work on art conceptualization for magazine.

November: Due date for content. Editing all content and doing initial layout.

December: Layout completion. Finishing touches.

January: Print the magazine, for distribution at start of Spring 2025 semester.

How do you propose to use the funds requested? Please include specific budget information.

Printing 750 copies of the magazine will cost roughly \$4,500, inclusive of delivery fees. The funds will directly pay for the magazine (and potential page orders as needed).

If it is successful, I may want to create a literary journalism course that feeds directly into creation of a magazine. I am always looking at ways to invigorate and support the division with new coursework, and I can see a class like that being very exciting!
