Glendale Community College Foundation Grant Application for the Noncredit ESL Outreach and Retention Program at Glendale Community College

Dear Glendale Community College Foundation Grant Committee,

1. What do you propose to do?

We propose to enhance the Noncredit ESL Outreach and Retention Program at Glendale Community College (GCC) by expanding our outreach efforts, improving retention strategies, and providing additional support services to Noncredit ESL students. This program aims to increase enrollment, retention, and success rates among noncredit ESL students, helping them to achieve their educational. career goals, and self-fulfillment goals. Currently, there is no existing funding or budget allocated for this program.

The GCC Outreach and Retention Program and its coordinator enhance student retention and foster a sense of belonging within the Glendale Community College community. By increasing students' familiarity with the campus and its resources and facilitating meaningful interactions with faculty, staff, and peers, the program supports students in maintaining their academic progress towards credit courses and successful entry into the workforce.

Additionally, through a culturally responsive and trauma-informed approach, the program addresses the unique support needs of adult learners, immigrants, refugees, displaced homemakers, and non-traditional students in the city of Glendale. Student life events funded by the Glendale Community College Foundation play a crucial role in helping these students integrate and see themselves as valued members of their community.

2. Who will be involved in the project/program?

The project will involve a collaborative team consisting of:

Noncredit ESL Outreach and Retention Coordinator: Implement and supervise activities
Noncredit ESL Division Chair: Oversee program implementation and coordinate activities.
Glendale Community College Student Services: Provide resources, tabling presence, and outreach about program services in multiple languages to Noncredit students
Garfield Campus Classified Staff Members: Assisting with implementation of activities
Community Partners: Local organizations and businesses that will support outreach events by providing resources to students.

3. What are the benefits of this project/program to the students, college, and the community?

<u>Students</u>: Improved access to ESL education, personalized support, higher retention and completion rates, and better integration into the campus and local communities and workforce. <u>College</u>: Increased enrollment in noncredit courses, enhanced reputation as a provider of quality ESL education, and alignment with the college's mission to serve diverse populations.

<u>Community</u>: Greater engagement with the college, improved language skills among community members, and stronger local workforce development.

4. How does this project/program support the College's Institutional Strategic Plan?

This program directly supports GCC's Institutional Strategic Plan by enhancing student support services and increasing retention and completion rates among ESL students, providing equitable access to education for non-native English speakers and fostering an inclusive learning environment, and strengthening partnerships with local organizations and increasing community outreach efforts.

In order to evaluate this project's success, we will survey students, as well as closely monitor the number of students benefiting from the events and determine the impact of them participating in our activities.

10. If your project/program is successful, how will it inform your practice moving forward?

We will use these findings to refine and expand our services, ensuring that all students, particularly non-traditional and underserved populations, receive the support they need to

succeed academically and integrate into the college community. Additionally, the success of this program will encourage the adoption of similar approaches across other departments, promoting a campus-wide commitment to student success and inclusivity. Lessons learned will inform future initiatives and help to continually improve support services for Noncredit students, ensuring long-term sustainability and success of the ESL program.

11. How do you plan to evaluate this project's success?

The success of the project will be evaluated through:

<u>Enrollment and Retention Data</u>: Tracking enrollment numbers, retention rates, and course completion rates of ESL students.

<u>Student Surveys</u>: Collecting feedback from students on their experiences and the support services provided.

<u>Community Partner Feedback</u>: Gathering input from community partners on the effectiveness of outreach efforts.

Progress Reports: Regular progress reports detailing achievements and areas for improvement.

12. Offering Continued Professional Development

After receiving a grant for Noncredit ESL student Outreach and Retention programming, offering professional development to faculty is essential to ensure they are equipped with the necessary skills and knowledge to effectively support nontraditional and disproportionately impacted students. Strategies include: faculty and staff workshops on student communication and culturally responsive and trauma-informed pedagogy.

Fall 2024:

- Welcome Week students are welcomed to campus with Glendale Community College Garfield Campus and Glendale Community College Foundation-branded folders that contain support resource flyers from our academic, basic needs, and Garfield programming (A campus map. and flyers from: CalWORKS, Cares Market, Counseling, Multicultural Community Engagement Center, the Parent Support Center, and the Noncredit ESL & Business Divisions)
- Campus Resource Fair highlights our counseling, basic need, transfer, workforce, and academic support resources for day time and evening students at the Garfield Campus in conjunction with Glendale Community College student services departments
