Mentoring Programs

Many of us understand the impact that a mentor can have on someone's educational and/or career experience. When developing the Mentoring Men of Color (MMC) program and the Mentoring STEM Students of Color (MSTEM) program, it was important to create something that had an outcomes-based model at its core. Our Student Equity mentoring programs seek to match students with GCC faculty, administrators, and/or staff who provide opportunities for self-discovery and leadership, professional guidance, and promote engagement to increase motivation, retention, graduation, and transfer rates. These programs require an activity-based mentor-mentee partnerships and aim to cultivate participants' self-confidence, highlight racial affinity, and nurture students' cultural wealth. This year, students worked on a variety of

projects with their mentors, including video game development, learning about and creating a garden, implementing a book club, helping redesign syllabi, leveraging student voice for instructional services, clearing and staining fish to make it transparent enough to study under a microscope, and much more! University Tours

Our in-person university tours continue to thrive! This year, we offered students multiple opportunities to participate. We set up tours to local campuses including CSUN and CPP! Students were able to learn about what these universities offer, explored their transfer options and interacted with their peers. We also coordinated Northern and a Southern California University Tours, where we visited UC Santa Barbara, UC Berkeley, Cal Poly SLO, San Diego State, CSU Fullerton and CSU Los Angeles! We visited service areas that would be beneficial for our students, received admissions presentations, and gave students opportunities to explore the campuses on their own. Students also participated

in sightseeing, including the **Golden Gate Bridge** in San Francisco and **Embarcadero** in San Diego. For many of our students, this was their first time visiting these monumental places and they all demonstrated excitement and gratitude for such experiences. We look forward to future trips and creating more opportunities for our students!

During his time at GCC, Josh was in the Black Scholars learning community, in ASGCC, and he participated in the NASA Community College Aerospace Scholars (NCAS) Program, which demonstrated to him that his dreams were obtainable. Starting GCC was difficult, especially given that he had recently moved to California and was balancing a full-time job and his education. He transferred to Cal Lutheran University in fall of 2020 and has since graduated with a B.A in Computer Science. Josh is currently working at the **NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory**! He works in the field of cybersecurity, specifically utilizing Splunk and Python, to monitor and analyze security events, develop scripts to automate processes, and implement measures to protect the organization's data and systems from security threats.

Josh wanted to share the following:

"My success might look good now, but it came with a rocky start. GCC is not just a college, but an institution that feels like home. You may not feel college-ready, or have dreams of working at NASA and going to space, but joining services like Black Scholars, ASGCC, student clubs, and talking with professors will inspire you. Learning Communities

The goal for our learning communities is to create a sense of belonging, create community, and help students build genuine connections with one another and the campus at large. We currently have three learning communities, **Black Scholars**, dedicated to supporting Black and African-American students at GCC, **La Comunidad** which supports students who are Latino/a/x and **APIDA**, a learning community for students who are Asian American, Pacific Islander or Desi American. Participants engage with one another through various social mixers, discuss and explore culture and identity through learning community group meetings, and receive specialized academic counseling.
