- Thank you all. School hasn't even started yet and look at this room full of red shirts here. ASGCC has a special place within this college. Student leadership has for decades been one of the centers of how this college functions and how we find our North Star. I want you to know that what you do makes an impact. Two years ago, our student trustee worked with us, went to Sacramento, and we were able to get four and a half million dollars to bring a virtual reality center that opened in May. If you haven't seen it yet, maybe we should have one of your meetings there. But that really came from student leadership. When we talk about advocacy, Alan and I have worked in different roles for decades now but it's not our voice that legislators want to hear, it's yours. We can say what we think students need but hearing it from a student who has a personal story of why they need that is much more impactful than anything we can say with data on a sheet. GCC wrote and cosponsored a bill with Senator Portantino to have in-state tuition for people fleeing global conflicts. It is the statement that's important, being able to tell our communities that through student leadership, there was noticed and a change needed to occur, and we were able to change it. It's the student voice that really matters. The question that I have for you is, what's the next policy we need to change? What's going on in this state that you as student leaders want to say, this is something Glendale Community College needs to be behind. We need to know what those are, and I hope that you take this as a challenge to really find your voice. No answer is needed now, but I just want to say how grateful we are that you are here. Your leadership is here but more than your presence, we now need your voice, and we're hoping to amplify that voice so that it's loud and heard and it echoes off these hills that way it really should.
