Course Description and Course Note:

FIL 115 is designed for heritage speakers of Filipino or other linguistically qualified students. It provides instruction that builds upon the existing reading, writing, speaking and listening skills and the cultural heritage and knowledge of these students. Structure of the language, oral and written communication, fundamentals of grammar, and composition are included. The course increases awareness of linguistic registers, introduces a more advanced vocabulary beyond the familiar routine and develops an appreciation for Philippine cultures as manifested in Filipino speaking populations in the homeland and in the United States. This course is conducted entirely in Filipino. Note: Heritage and native speakers of Filipino that wish to enroll and do not meet the prerequisite may contact the Language Arts Division to have the prerequisite waived.
