The application fee is \$80 <u>per</u> campus; \$95 <u>per</u> campus for international and non-immigrant applicants

If you qualify for the fee waiver, you can apply to up to 4 UC campuses for **free**!

Eligibility Requirements for Fall 2025 Transfer



You must complete the following requirements by the end of the Spring 2025:

- 60 UC-transferable units
- 7-course pattern
- 2.4 GPA in UC-transferable coursework (2.8 if you're a nonresident)
- Required/recommended major preparation

7-Course Pattern



- 1. English Composition (ENGL 101, 101+, or 101H)
- 2. English Composition Critical Thinking (ENGL 102, 102H, or 104)
- 3. Mathematical Concepts and Quantitative Reasoning (IGETC Area 2A)
- 4. 4 courses chosen from at least 2 of the following subject areas:
 - Arts and Humanities (IGETC Areas 3A and 3B)
 - Social and Behavioral Sciences (IGETC Area 4)
 - Physical and Biological Sciences (IGETC Areas 5A and 5B)

Statement of Legal Residence

The University of California requires all applicants to complete a Statement of Legal Residence (SLR) to be evaluated for a Residency Classification for purposes of UC tuition. For further explanation, read the full UC Residence Policy and Guidelines [2]. As UC policy is subject to change during the year, if there are any discrepancies between any Statement of Legal Residence and the Residence Policy and Guidelines, the Residence Policy and Guidelines govern the rules around Residence for Tuition purposes at all times.

The University of California's Statement of Legal Residence is made up of three parts: Physical presence, Intent to remain in California, and Immigration status.

- 1) Physical Presence You and your parents must be physically present in California for more than 365 days immediately prior to the residence determination date. If you moved to California primarily to attend the University of California or another school, you are ineligible for a Resident classification for tuition purposes.
- 2) Intent to remain in California You and your parents must have established your intent to make California your permanent home for more than 365 days immediately prior to the residence determination date and must have relinquished ties to any prior place of residence outside of California. Please read the UC Residence Policy and Guidelines [2] to learn more about how to document your intent to remain in California.
- 3) Immigration status You and your parents must be citizens or permanent residents of the United States, or be present under a valid I-94 for an eligible visa, and have held that immigration status for more than 365 days prior to the residence determination date.

In some cases, applicants who do not satisfy all three parts above may qualify for a Special Circumstances, Exemption, or Waiver provision (such as an AB 540 nonresident supplemental tuition exemption) and will be asked to submit additional supplemental information at a future date. A full list of exemptions and waivers can be found in the UC Residence Policy and Guidelines 🖾

Please note: Even if you were previously classified as a resident in another system, you will still need to meet the University of California's classification requirements.


UC San Diego college ranking *






The Lowdown



- Discuss how you have taken initiative to learn more about the major/field and have gained greater knowledge and depth




Submission Confirmation



- Once you submit, you will see a Submission Confirmation screen that shows the complete list of campuses applied to, fees, fee waiver, application ID, date submitted, and payment method
- You will also receive a confirmation email
- Take note of your application ID, as this will be used throughout the admission process, including decision release occurring in the spring
- Do not send official transcripts—if admitted, you will submit the final transcripts at that time

- Regularly check the email you provided on the application
- Activate campus portal accounts and check them regularly
- Complete the Transfer Academic Update (TAU) by January 31, 2025
 - Include grades through Fall 2024 and planned coursework through Summer 2025
- Some UCs require a supplemental application
 - Failure to submit these will result in denied admission
- Follow all deadlines for requested documents
