Substantive Change Actions

Irvine Valley College and Saddleback College: Deferred approval of Programs offered at Advanced Technology Education Park

San Joaquin Valley College: Deferred approval of Online Clinical and Administrative Medical A.S. Degree, Online Heating, Ventilation, Air Conditioning, and Refrigeration A.S. Degree at Hesperia, Modesto, Rancho Cucamonga, and Visalia Campuses.

Actions taken by the Substantive Change Committee between January 2010 and June 2010 to Approve the Following:

Barstow Community College: to offer 18 degrees and 22 certificates more than 50% via distance education delivery mode.

College of San Mateo: to offer 57 degrees and 29 certificates more than 50% via distance education delivery mode.

Fullerton College: to offer 51 degrees and 30 certificates more than 50% via distance education delivery mode.

Hartnell College: to offer two degree and certificate programs (Administration of Justice: Correctional Science and Criminal Justice) more than 50% via distance education delivery mode; and add a new location, an advanced technology campus, located four miles from the main campus (1752 East Alisal St., Salinas, CA).

Los Angeles Valley College: to offer 43 degrees and four certificates more than 50% via distance education mode.

Las Positas College: to offer an A.A. degree in Business Administration and Social Science (General); and seven certificates more than 50% via distance education mode.

Rio Hondo College: to offer ten degrees and five certificates more than 50% via distance education mode.

Saddleback College: to offer 23 degrees and 17 certificates more than 50% via distance education mode.

San Diego City College: to offer 56 degrees and certificates more than 50% via distance education mode.

San Joaquin Delta College: to offer 15 degrees and 44 certificates more than 50% via distance education mode.

San Joaquin Valley College: to offer a Pharmacy Technology Program with an A.S. degree and Certificate of Completion at the Hesperia Campus.

Western Career College (Carrington College of California): to add a General Business, Sales, Marketing, and Accounting Online Program and a General Studies Online Program.
