METHODS OF ASSESSMENT: We randomly selected and read every fourth essay and based our assessments on the SLO rubric criteria.			

ANALYSIS OF ASSESSMENT: What do these results tell you about your students' achievements on the targeted SLO(s)? Students are doing relatively well across all SLO areas; however, lowest scores seem to accumulate in the last two areas (Grammar and Mechanics and Documentation and Formatting). Moreover, four of the eight samples

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submitted scored "weak" or "adequate" in all nine categories. On the other hand, the other four ranked much higher in almost all categories.

We will need to collect a larger sample to determine whether these findings are indicative of most 101 classes. However, might consider strengthening instruction in Grammar/documentation.
